PREREQUISITES

Completion of Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology with a grade of "C" or better within the last 5 years. Successful completion of the TEAS V examination or higher version of TEAS, within two (2) attempts maximum. (=>62% for TEAS)

Students will be notified of TEAS testing dates within the application period.

(NOTE: All courses, including prerequisites, must be completed with "C" or better. A grade of "C-" is not accepted.)
