

**Cal-GETC Certification**
California General Education Transfer Curriculum

REVISED 8/21/25

- **OBJECTIVE:** The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) is the singular general education pathway for California Community College (CCC) students to fulfill lower-division general education requirements necessary for transfer and admission to both the California State University (CSU) and the University of California (UC).
- **EXCEPTIONS:** Cal-GETC is not recommended for engineering, math, science, or high-unit majors. UC "readmits"—students who leave a UC, attend a community college, and return to the same UC—cannot use Cal-GETC. CSU has no system-wide policy restricting Cal-GETC use for "reverse-transfer" students.
- **CERTIFICATION:** Students transferring using the Cal-GETC pattern may receive only full certification. Partial certification is not permitted. This and other rules are governed by the Cal-GETC Standards, Policies, and Procedures Manual ([current version 1.3](https://assist.org/)).
- **Disclaimer:** Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this form at the time of publication. Students are encouraged to see a counselor, check the VVC Catalog, and check <https://assist.org/> regularly for the most current information about approved general education courses.

*Cal-GETC begins Fall 2025. Students with continued enrollment prior to Fall 2025 can follow IGETC or CSU GE Breadth.

*A minimum "C" grade is required in each college course for Cal-GETC: A grade "C" is defined as a minimum of 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale or a Credit/Pass that is defined by the institution as being equivalent to a letter grade of "C" (2.0) or higher.

☐	Score of 5 or higher on the International Baccalaureate Higher Level (IBHL) examinations in languages other than English
☐	Satisfactory completion of an Achievement Test administered by a college (score: proficiency equivalent to two years of high school language)
