There are currently three concentrations available in the Liberal Studies major. Here is the intent of each:

- **General Concentration:** This includes all the subject matter content needed to pass the CBEST and CSET exams and to enter the Multiple Subject (K-8) teaching credential program. Note that this concentration requires students to choose a specialty area of 12-21 units.
- **Integrated Concentration:** This includes everything in the General Concentration, plus the Multiple Subject (K-8) credential program as part of the BA degree.
- **Spanish Studies Concentration:** This is similar to the General Concentration, but it requires a higher level of competency in Spanish. It is designed for students interested in teaching English as a second language to children whose first language is Spanish. This concentration also prepares students to work in a bilingual/Spanish classroom setting.
