

Advanced Placement Exams

Victor Valley College recognizes achievements by students who have successfully completed Advanced Placement Examinations as authorized by the CollegeBoard. Students who have completed exams in the Advanced Placement Program with a score of 3, 4, or 5 may be granted credit for the purposes of major, general education, elective and/or to serve as prerequisites in the college's sequence of courses.

Students enrolled at Victor Valley College will receive credit for Advanced Placement Examinations if official scores are sent to the Admissions & Records Office and an External Transcript Evaluation is submitted. Please be aware that other institutions may evaluate Advanced Placement credits differently. Students should check with a counselor or the institution to which they plan to transfer for an evaluation of their Advanced Placement credits.

This chart provides information on specific credit awarded at VVC relating to equivalent courses, general education areas cleared, and units awarded. Information related to transfer units for California State University (CSU) and University of California (UC), CSU GE Breadth, IGETC, CalGETC, and UC transfer eligibility is also provided for reference. Please refer to the CSU and UC system websites and IGETC and CalGETC Standards Manuals for updates and additional information. The information presented here is based on the [IGETC version 2.4](#) and [Cal-GETC version 1.2](#) Standard, Policies, and Procedures manuals.

CSU and UC systems have credit limitations. Please see official sources (links below) for information. Individual university campus policies may vary. Please check with each campus website for specific details regarding the awarding of AP credit for each institution.

Duplication with college courses. Students should be advised that college courses taken after passing an AP exam may duplicate AP, IB (International Baccalaureate) and/or A-Level examinations. Additionally, exams may duplicate each other (for example, an AP or IB exam in the same subject area). This may also apply to CLEP (College-Level Examination Program).

If the student does duplicate an exam with another exam of the same subject content, and/or an exam with a college course, VVC and most institutions will award credit only once.

Footnotes

VVC Limitations

1. AP Biology exam equivalent course will not be used in lieu of published course prerequisites for BIOL 221 – Microbiology and BIOL 231 – Human Physiology. An appropriate college course must be completed prior to admission into these advanced biology courses.
2. AP Music Theory exam will only result in elective credit at VVC. Students will still need to complete a pre-test to determine which class in the Music Theory sequence is best for them to start.

CSU Limitations

Earlier versions of AP Exams have been removed from previous versions of CSU General Education and graduation requirements. Check CSU websites for guidance.

3. These units count toward CSU admission eligibility only. Refer to the [CSU Credit for Prior Learning](#) policy for additional guidance.
4. If a student passes more than one AP exam in calculus or computer science, only one examination may be applied to the baccalaureate.
5. Students who pass AP Environmental Science earn 4 units of credit. Tests prior to Fall 2009 may apply either to 5A+5C or 5B+5C towards CSU GE. Fall 2009 or later, those credits may only apply to 5A+5C.
6. If a student passes more than one AP exam in physics, only 6 units of credit may be applied to the baccalaureate, and only 4 units of credit may be applied to the CSU GE area.

UC Limitations

UC system has a systemwide policy for admission and GE. Note, even an exam with multiple designations can only meet one requirement. In addition, credit per campus and major vary. 7. Art and Design, maximum 5.3 units for all three exams.
8. English, maximum 5.3 units for both exams.
9. Calculus, maximum 5.3 for both exams.
10. Physics, maximum 5.3 units for all exams.

Additional notes:

- a) Calculus BC Exam, AB subscore. Students who take the Calculus BC examination and earn a subscore of 3 or higher on the Calculus AB portion will receive 2.6 semester units for the Calculus AB examination, even if they do not receive a score of 3 or higher on the BC examination (note that the maximum credit awarded for both exams is 5.3 semester units).
- b) No credit is awarded for the Precalculus exam offered in 2024 and beyond.
- c) Music Theory subscore. UC will grant credit for the full Music Theory exam. Students who earn only a subscore will not receive exam credit.

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
