



## Associate Degree Respiratory Therapy Curriculum

The Respiratory Therapy Program prepares students for a career in and integral part of a health care team. Respiratory Therapists (RTs) care for a wide variety of patients experiencing cardiopulmonary disorders. Example responsibilities include: patient assessment, care plans, diagnostic testing, and pulmonary treatments. Most Respiratory Therapists are employed in hospitals, although increasingly, there are career opportunities in nursing homes, private homes, with medical equipment supply companies, in-home health agencies, and in physicians' offices. Many students go on to pursue bachelor's degrees in Emergency Medical Care or in other related health fields.
