



Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) Curriculum

Completion of a high school diploma, GED/HiSET, or AA/AS is required. The prerequisite courses (below) can take two or more years to complete. The VVC Nursing Program core take two years to complete. Many graduates continue to a bachelor's and master's degrees in nursing or other medical fields. Admissions Process Overview

Minimum Qualifications:

- All required coursework (general education and science prerequisites) must be completed and have a grade (in-progress coursework is not accepted)
- Maximum of two withdrawals or incompletes between Anatomy, Microbiology and Physiology (EW will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis)
- Anatomy, Microbiology, and Physiology must be completed within the last 5 years of applying to the program
- A minimum 2.75 GPA required between Anatomy, Microbiology and Physiology
- No grades lower than a C accepted ("C-" grades are not accepted)
- A minimum cumulative/overall 2.75 GPA required
- TEAS exam score of 70% or higher is required for consideration
- Students with prior participation in a nursing program are required to apply as a transfer student (meet with a Health Science Pathway Counselor)

The top 65 qualified applicants with the highest points will advance and will be invited to take the TEAS exam, if they have not already done so.

Students not selected as part of the top 65 will need to reapply to the program.

TEAS Test:

- Prior to applying, applicants may take the TEAS at their own expense. For information, study materials, and TEAS registration details, visit www.atitesting.com. Test results must be sent directly to the VVC Nursing Department by [ATI TEAS](#) and must arrive by the VVC nursing application deadline (Visit the [VVC Nursing Department](#) for details)
- VVC highly encourages students to begin studying for the TEAS exam well in advance of taking the exam

Applicant Selection:

Of the 65 qualified applicants who pass the TEAS with a 70% or above or who already passed and had their score sent directly to the VVC Nursing Program, the top 40, based on the sum of the total points and TEAS score, will begin the program the following fall or spring term.

- Individuals not selected in the group of 40 are required to reapply
- Individuals who did not pass the TEAS with a 70% may retake the TEAS exam
- VVC only allows two TEAS exam attempts within a 5-year period
