VVC MENTAL HEALTH INTERVENTION PROPOSAL

Students who are facing personal problems, feeling emotionally distressed, or experiencing a crisis situation may not have adequate supports or skills to effectively cope with life challenges while simultaneously balancing the demands of school, work and family.

Currently VVC does not have a process in place whereby students can receive appropriate assistance while on campus. Typically counselors and/or instructors have more contact with students and more opportunities to observe student behaviors <u>but</u> are limited by the sheer number of students and competing responsibilities faced on a daily basis. Before a student reaches a crisis situation, we need to have preventative measures in place that can assist students in resolving stressors.

The proposed program would employ multi-level strategies to achieve the following goals:

- 1. Serve as a resource for college faculty, staff and students.
- 2. Collaborate with community partners to provide referrals to students.
- 3. Recruit and train students to be peer mentors/advocates.
- 4. Utilize MSW interns to provide short-term individual and group interventions to students and employees.

These goals would be accomplished through campus and community collaboration which include both prevention and crisis management strategies to educate and support members of the VVC community.

Components of the program would include the development and facilitation of workshops and training for students, faculty and staff, Health and Wellness events to educate the campus about mental-health related topics such as, stress, grief and loss, depression and, short-term therapeutic counseling.

Collaboration with key partners such as the Department of Behavioral Health, local hospitals, and schools of graduate social work would provide opportunities for students to receive mental health screenings and treatment. Through these resources, students will be provided with the tools and resources necessary to maintain healthy life styles and improve their decision-making abilities.
