Dr. Silverman announced that the board has directed that we continue make progress towards a bond which has led to this discussion workshop with no action anticipated for the bond. Catherine Lew of the Lew Edwards Group that specializes in assisting Community College districts in seeking funding and local funding solutions was available via telephone to provide information and answer any questions relating to the bond.

Catherine Lew provided an overview of the process in determining whether to place a measure on the ballot. The board is wise to look at a November 2008 election as a potential opportunity because record setting demographics of voters more likely to support education measures will be going to the ballot. The 2008 election timeframe should be carefully considered.

Following a discussion period which consisted of concerns and questions from the Board of Trustees and the public, Dr. Silverman summarized that the college has taken steps to included changes the Master Plan and Facilities Master Plan to include off-campus centers. Two surveys have been conducted which have shown positive responses. It is important to have the cooperation and partnerships of the community.

College Organization

Dr. Silverman reported on the recent changes to the overall college organization recommended by the Synergy Group and the status of the open positions.

On behalf of Babette Dersham, Margaret Kagy expressed her concern that Instructional Media Services should report under Educational Services and not Technology & Informational services. Dr. Silverman indicated that this will be addressed when the College Council meets.

DISTRICT AGREEMENT FOR EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES PLANNING AND COORDINATION CONSULTING SERVICES

This agreement is made and entered into this 1st day of August 1, 2008 and between Victor Valley Community College District (hereinafter referred to as the "DISTRICT") and Campus Planning Group (hereinafter referred to as the "CONTRACTOR").

Whereas, the District finds that the Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform special services to the District, the District and Contractor agree as follows:

I. NATURE AND SCOPE OF THE SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CONTRACTOR:

A. Description of the Services to be Provided:

- Five-Year Construction Plan Complete the Five-Year Construction Plan to be approved by the District and submitted to the State Chancellor's Office by July 1, 2009 or the due date established by the California Community College Chancellor's Office. This plan shall establish the needs and priorities for the planning, budgeting and construction of the District's capital outlay projects.
- Inventory and Utilization of Campus Space Assist the District in updating the campus inventory and utilization of space report to determine capacity load ratios. Complete the Space Inventory Report to be approved by the District and submitted to the State Chancellor's Office by October 1, 2008 or the due date established by the California Community College Chancellor's Office.
- Enrollment Projections Assist the District in developing enrollment and Weekly Student Contact Hours (WSCH) projections with the State Chancellor's Office. Incorporate these projections in the Five-Year Plan.
- 4. <u>Project Proposals</u> Assist the District and the District's Architect in the development of Initial Project Proposals (IPPs) and Final Project Proposals (FPPs) for submittal to the State Chancellor's Office by July 1, 2009 or the due date established by the California Community College Chancellor's Office. These proposals shall address the project scope (space, systems and equipment requirements) and provide cost estimates.
- Coordination with the State Chancellor's Office, Control Agencies and Budget Committee
 Consultants Provide coordination of the Five-Year Plan, Project Proposals, and previously submitted capital outlay budget requests and capital outlay projects with the District, the State Chancellor's Office, control agencies and the legislative Budget Subcommittee consultants.
 - The services may also include representing the District's proposals and budget requests during the subcommittee hearings on the 2009 Budget Bill.
- 6. <u>Special Services</u> Provide special services relating to the services described above, as agreed upon by the District and the Contractor.

B. Specific Contractor Requirements.

- 1. Inventory and Utilization of Campus Space:
 - a. Update the campus space inventory with District staff, making changes as necessary.
 - b. Review space utilization with District staff.
 - c. Submit findings and recommendations to the District to consolidate and reduce surplus space and provide favorable capacity/load ratios.
 - d. Incorporate inventory data into the Five-Year Plan.

2. Enrollment Projections

- Coordinate enrollment and WSCH projections with the State Chancellor's Office and the District.
- Incorporate projections into the Five-Year Plan.

3. Five-Year Construction Plans:

- a. Review the District's Educational and Facility Master Plans and previous Five-Year Plan with District staff in order to assure that the plans are consistent.
- b. Coordinate the program needs, scope, primary and secondary space changes, cost estimates, and implementation schedules for all proposed facility projects with District Staff and the architect prior to incorporating these projects within the Five-year Plan.
- c. Determine project priorities with District staff.
- d. Determine the capacity/load ratios for each proposed project.
- Review the availability of state and district funding with the State Chancellor's Office and District staff.
- f. Submit Five-Year Plans to District and State Chancellor's Office for approval.

4. Project Proposals:

- Assist the District's staff and architect in developing facility and system project proposals, providing instructional and administrative space and system needs and WSCH utilization. Coordinate primary and secondary space changes and assist in developing cost estimates.
- b. Review completeness and accuracy of the project proposals before being submitted to the State Chancellor's Office.
- c. Assist in securing necessary environmental documentation to be submitted with the proposals.
- d. Submit Project Proposals to District and State Chancellor's Office for approval.

5. Coordination of Plans and Proposals:

- a. Coordinate the Five-Year Plan, project proposals and budget requests with the State Chancellor's Office, the Department of Finance and the Office of the Legislative Analyst. Provide requested information on a timely basis and assist District staff in resolving problems identified by the control agencies.
- b. When requested by the District, coordinate the projects proposals and the budget requests with committee consultants prior to budget hearings and report committee actions to the District.
- c. Inform District of budget progress.

III. FEES, REIMBURSEMENTS AND TERMS.

- A. <u>Fees</u>. The Contractor's fee for the above services shall not exceed \$15,000 plus reimbursable expenses. Invoices for services shall be submitted monthly to the District for payment based upon \$90.00 per hour for professional services and \$70.00 per hour for technical services consisting of but not limited to word processing including design and layout using Adobe PageMaker, proficiency in use and terminology of FUSION (a program provided by the State Chancellor's Office), coordination and review of technical information, document preparation and timeline management. Reimbursable expenses shall also be invoiced monthly.
- B. Materials and Equipment to be Furnished by the Contractor and Expenses to be Reimbursed by the District. The Contractor shall furnish whatever materials and special equipment are required in the performance of this contract, with the exception of the following Contractor's expenses that shall be reimbursed by the District:
 - Travel, lodging, rental car and other per diem expenses (reasonable direct cost, without markup).
 - 2. Automotive mileage at \$0.56 per mile.
 - 3. Additional services provided by outside consultants, if required and approved by the District (direct cost, without markup).
 - 4. Printing, reproduction, fax, and mailing costs (direct cost, without markup).
- C. Where the Work is to be Performed. Contractor's services shall be performed on site at Victor Valley College, the Contractor's Office and/or other sites as designated by the District and the Contractor.
- D. <u>Date and Time for Performance and Completion of Services</u>. Under this contract, the Contractor shall provide services in accordance with the time and dates specified above.
- E. Renewal Terms. This contract may be renewed upon mutual agreement and consent of the Contractor and the District. In each renewal, however, a new contract shall be issued and appropriately signed in the manner designated herein.
- IV. DURATION OF AGREEMENT. The term of this Agreement shall be from August 1, 2008 through and including July 31, 2009, unless terminated earlier by either party as provided in Section VI of this Agreement.

V. FAILURE TO PROVIDE SATISFACTORY SERVICE Abandonment of Project, Cancellation of Agreement

- A. If, at any time during the performance of this Agreement District determines, at the District's sole discretion, that Contractor's services are or have become unsatisfactory, or if at any time during the performance of this Agreement District determines, at its sole discretion, to suspend indefinitely or abandon the work under this Agreement, District shall have the right to cancel this Agreement and terminate the performance of Contractor's services hereunder. In the event of such cancellation, District shall give written notice to Contractor of its intention to cancel 30 days in advance of the effective date of cancellation.
- B. If the cancellation is for unsatisfactory performance, District shall be obligated to pay Contractor only for those services deemed by District to be satisfactory as of the effective date of the cancellation or termination. If the cancellation is the result of the District's decision to suspend indefinitely or abandon the work under this Agreement, District shall be obligated to pay Contractor only for those services performed by Contractor through the effective date of cancellation or termination.
- C. Contractor shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon 30 days notice, in writing, to District. In the event of cancellation by Contractor, District shall be obligated to pay Contractor only for those services performed by Contractor through the effective date of cancellation or termination.

- D. District shall have the right to terminate this Agreement for any reason on 30 days notice in writing. District shall be obligated to pay Contractor only for those services performed by Contractor through the effective date of cancellation or termination.
- VI. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. It is expressly understood and agreed that Contractor, while engaged in carrying out and complying with any terms and conditions of this Agreement, is an independent contractor and is not an employee of the District. It is further expressly understood and agreed that Contractor is not entitled to receive from District any benefits not expressly herein provided for including, but not limited to overtime, any retirement benefits, worker's compensation benefits, injury leave, or any other leave benefit.
- VII. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS. Contractor shall provide and deliver the services herein described. Contractor shall not assign any interest in this Agreement, and shall not transfer any interest in the same without prior written consent of District thereto; provided, however, that claims for money due or to become due Contractor from District under this Agreement may be assigned without such approval. Notice of any such assignment or transfer shall be furnished promptly to District.

VIII. SPECIAL PROVISIONS

- Contractor shall comply with all federal, state and local laws and ordinances applicable to such work
- B. In accordance with the provision of Section 3700 of the Labor Code, Contractor shall secure the payment of compensation to his/her employees. Contractor, in signing this Agreement, certifies that prior to performing the work under this contract that he/she is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for workmen's compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provision of that code, and will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract.
- C. The duties of Contractor may not be subcontracted except with the prior written consent of the District. Subcontracts permitted by the District shall be subject to the requirements of this Agreement and Contractor is responsible for all subcontracting arrangements and the delivery of services as set forth in this Agreement. Contractor shall be responsible for the performance of any subcontractor. Contractor warrants and agrees that any subcontract resulting from its performance under the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall include a provision that Contractor shall require the subcontractor to abide by the terms and conditions of this Agreement relevant to the subcontractor, as well as all other applicable Federal and State laws, rules and regulations that have been or may hereafter be established.
- D. This agreement may be amended by the mutual written consent of the parties hereto. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this Agreement on the day and year indicated below:

AGREEMENT FOR CONSULTING SERVICES

REVISED as of July 27, 2008

This Agreement is made between The Lew Edwards Group, a California Corporation ("Consultant"), and Victor Valley Community College District ("Client"). The parties agree as follows:

1. Services to be Performed.

Consultant shall, with consultation from Client, provide strategic bond feasibility and planning services related to a potential November 2008 Proposition 39 General Obligation Bond Measure. Consultant services will include the following:

- Review Client's polling results and provide perspectives and strategy on bond feasibility, including strengths and weaknesses.
- ➤ Recommend a timeline and budget for the balance of District Bond Planning.
- ➤ Develop and refine key External Community and Internal Stakeholder Messages to describe Client's fiscal, academic, and facility needs.
- ➤ Conceive and recommend an Internal Stakeholder Update program utilizing effective Internal Messages for students, faculty, and staff to be updated on Bond Planning Efforts, such as staff email updates; foundation/donor/alumni updates; and student announcements.
- ➤ Conceive and recommend a nonpartisan, communications program utilizing Key Messages focused on critical Client constituents and audiences, such as Opinion Leader/Key Influential updates; a selected Speakers' Bureau Outreach Program; an Earned (nonpaid) Media program; and Informational Mail as permitted by Client's budget.
- Conduct trainings of President's Cabinet as appropriate for Message Dissemination.
- ➤ Provide strategic input to Bond Counsel on the text of the voter information and handbook materials describing Client's Bond Plan.
- ➤ Initiate planning for nonpartisan student voter registration activities as appropriate.

The term and scope of services of this Agreement shall commence upon execution and be completed no later than August 8, 2008. The parties expressly agree that legal advice is not within Consultant's scope of services.

2. Fees.

Consultant's fee for these services shall be Eighteen Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$18,500) payable as follows:

- Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) due and payable on July 31, 2008; and
- The remaining balance of Eight Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$8,500) due and payable by August 15, 2008.

Consultant shall be reimbursed separately for mileage; telephone toll charges; photocopying and faxes; express mail, messenger or delivery services; airfare; car rental not to exceed Two Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500). Only those expenses actually incurred will be billed, at cost.

3. Indemnification.

The parties shall hold one another, their respective agents and employees, harmless from any and all liability arising from or related to the performance of this Agreement, including third party legal actions caused by the acts or omissions of either the indemnifying party, their respective agents or employees, but excluding liability caused by the sole negligence of either party.

4. Notice.

All notices, requests, demands or other communications under this Agreement shall be in writing. Notices shall be sufficiently given for all purposes as follows: Personal Delivery; First-Class Mail; Certified Mail; Overnight Delivery.

5. Severability

If any term or provision of this Agreement shall be found illegal or unenforceable, then, notwithstanding, this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and such term or provision shall be deemed stricken.

6. Entire Agreement.

This Agreement supersedes any and all other agreements, whether oral or in writing, between the parties with respect to the subject of this Agreement. No other agreement, statement or promise not contained herein shall be valid or binding.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VICTOR VALLEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT ORDERING AN ELECTION, AND ESTABLISHING SPECIFICATIONS OF THE ELECTION ORDER

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the Victor Valley Community College District (the "District") has determined that the properties and facilities of the Victor Valley College need to be expanded, maintained, acquired, constructed, improved, furnished, and equipped to enable Victor Valley College to respond to the growing community demand for affordable, local higher education which will train and retrain local residents for higher-paying and skilled jobs, and enhance educational opportunities for the students who desire to transfer to four-year universities; and

WHEREAS, due to the age and condition of some of the District's facilities, and due to the congestion on Bear Valley Road, the District has been less able to provide necessary and accessible education programs to meet the total needs of the community, and thus Victor Valley College must act to maintain and expand its classroom capacity in several locations, and provide a balance of job training, particularly in healthcare and public safety fields where there is a shortage of workers, and general education and basic skills classes close to the homes of its students; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the construction of new classrooms and labs for nursing and other health care programs, police, fire, emergency medical technician, and public safety programs; the provision of up-to-date computer technology; the enhancement of access for disabled students; and the improvement of facilities to provide students with more course options close to their homes are also among the highest priorities of the Board; and

WHEREAS, following the completion of the District's Five-Year Facilities Plan, and the updating of its 2007 Educational Master Plan, the importance of establishing local higher education centers such as a Workforce Training and Development Center and a Public Services Academy to better serve the job training and college transfer needs of the community, which has become a cornerstone of the Board's vision for Victor Valley College; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding concerted and ongoing efforts by the District to obtain sufficient facility money from the State of California (the "State"), the State has been unable to provide the District with enough money for the District to adequately maintain and enhance Victor Valley College for students; and

WHEREAS, if the District passed a local general obligation bond, the Board believes that Victor Valley College would be eligible for over \$90 million of additional State matching funds to improve classrooms and labs on the Victor Valley College campus as well as to establish local Workforce Training and Public Service Academy Centers; and

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Board, it is advisable to provide additional funding for such facility, technology, and safety needs by means of a general obligation bond; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 46, approved by the voters of the State of California on June 3, 1986 ("Proposition 46"), amended Section 1(b) of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution by adding a provision which exempts from the 1% of full cash value limitation, those *ad valorem* taxes used to pay for debt service of any bonded indebtedness for the acquisition or improvement of real

property approved on or after July 1, 1978, by two-thirds of the votes cast by voters voting on the proposition; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2000, the voters of California approved the Smaller Classes, Safer Schools and Financial Accountability Act ("Proposition 39") which, as of its effective date, reduced the voter threshold for *ad valorem* tax levies used to pay for debt service or bonded indebtedness to 55% of the votes cast on a community college district general obligation bond; and

WHEREAS, concurrent with the passage of Proposition 39, Chapter 1.5, Part 10, Division 1, Title 1 (commencing with Section 15264) of the Education Code (the "Act") became operative and established requirements associated with the implementation of Proposition 39; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to make certain findings herein to be applicable to this election order and to establish certain performance audits, standards of financial accountability and citizen oversight which are contained in Proposition 39 and the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Board determines that the restrictions in Proposition 39, as interpreted by the Attorney General of the State, which prohibit any bond money to be used for teacher or administrator salaries and expenses, be strictly enforced by a citizens' oversight committee; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 15270, based upon a projection of assessed property valuation, the Board has determined that, if approved by voters, the tax rate levied to meet the debt service requirements of the bonds proposed to be issued will not exceed the Proposition 39 limits per year per \$100,000 of assessed valuation of taxable property; and

WHEREAS, Section 9400 *et seq.* of the Elections Code of the State of California (the "Elections Code") requires that a tax rate statement be contained in all official materials, including any ballot pamphlet prepared, sponsored or distributed by the District, relating to the election; and

WHEREAS, the Board now desires to authorize the filing of a ballot argument in favor of the proposition to be submitted to the voters at the election; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the California Elections Code, it is appropriate for the Board to request consolidation of the election with any and all other elections to be held on November 4, 2008, and to request that both the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters and the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters perform certain election services for the District; and

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Board, it is advisable to request the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters and the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters to call an election pursuant to Proposition 39 on the question of whether general obligation bonds shall be issued and sold on behalf of the District for purposes set forth below;

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VICTOR VALLEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Board, pursuant to Education Code Sections 15100 and Government Code Section 53506, hereby requests both the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters and the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters call an election under the provisions of Proposition 39 and the Act and submit to the electors of the District the question of whether bonds of the District in the

aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$300 million (the "Bonds") shall be issued and sold to raise money for the purposes described in Exhibits "A" and "B" hereto.

- <u>Section 2.</u> That the date of the election shall be November 4, 2008.
- Section 3. That the purpose of the election shall be for the voters in the District to vote on a proposition, a copy of which is attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference herein, containing the question of whether the District shall issue the Bonds to pay for improvements to the extent permitted by such proposition. In compliance with Proposition 39 and the Act, the ballot proposition in Exhibit "A" is subject to the following requirements and determinations:
- (a) that the proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be used only for the purposes set forth in the ballot measure and not for any other purpose, including teacher or administrator salaries or other operating expenses;
- (b) that the Board, in establishing the projects set forth in Exhibit "B," evaluated the safety, class size and offerings, and information technology needs of the District;
- (c) that the Board will cause to be conducted an annual, independent performance audit to ensure that the Bond moneys are expended for the projects identified in Exhibit "B" hereto;
- (d) that the Board will cause an annual, independent financial audit of the proceeds from the sale of Bonds to be conducted until all Bond proceeds have been expended;
- (e) that the Board will cause the appointment of a Citizens' Oversight Committee in compliance with Education Code Section 15278 no later than 60 days after the Board enters the election results in its minutes pursuant to Education Code Section 15274; and
- (f) that the tax levy authorized to secure the bonds of this election shall not exceed the Proposition 39 limit per \$100,000 of taxable property in the District when assessed valuation is projected by the District to increase in accordance with Article XIIIA of the California Constitution.
- Section 4. That the authority for ordering the election is contained in Education Code Sections 15100 *et seq.* and 15264 *et seq.* and Government Code Section 53506.
- Section 5. That the authority for the specifications of this election order is contained in Section 5322 of the Education Code.
- Section 6. That the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters and the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors are hereby requested to consolidate the election ordered hereby with any and all other elections to be held on November 4, 2008 within the District.
- Section 7. That this Resolution shall stand as the "order of election" to the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters and the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters to call an election within the boundaries of the District on November 4, 2008.
- <u>Section 8</u>. That the Secretary of the Board is hereby directed to deliver an original or a certified copy of this Resolution to the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters and the San Bernardino Registrar of Voters no later than August 8, 2008.

Section 9. That the maturity of any Bonds issued pursuant to Section 15100 of the Education Code, and Bonds issued pursuant to Section 53506 of the Government Code shall not exceed the maturity limits set forth therein, respectively. The maximum interest rate on any Bond shall not exceed the maximum rate allowed by Education Code Sections 15140 to 15143, as modified by Government Code Section 53531.

Section 10. That the Board requests the governing body of any such other political subdivision, or any officer otherwise authorized by law, to partially or completely consolidate such election and to further provide that the canvass be made by any body or official authorized by law to canvass the returns of the election, and that the Board consents to such consolidation.

Section 11. Pursuant to Section 5303 of the Education Code and Section 10002 of the Elections Code, the Boards of Supervisors of both Los Angeles County and San Bernardino County are requested to permit the Registrar of Voters of each respective County to render all services specified by Section 10418 of the Elections Code relating to the election, for which services the District agrees to reimburse both Los Angeles County and San Bernardino County, such services to include the publication of a Formal Notice of School Bond Election and the mailing of the sample ballot and tax rate statement (described in Section 9401 of the Elections Code) pursuant to the terms of Section 5363 of the Education Code and Section 12112 of the Elections Code.

BOND PROJECTS LIST

The Board of Trustees of the Victor Valley Community College District, to be responsive to the needs of its High Desert students and the community, evaluated the District's urgent and critical educational needs, including providing sufficient classrooms and labs to offer more courses and programs to students close to home, expanding instructional capacity for programs in nursing and vocational training, safety issues, class size and offerings, energy cost reduction and information and computer technology, in developing the scope of projects to be funded. In developing the scope of projects, the faculty, staff and students have prioritized the key health and safety needs so that the most critical needs and the most urgent and basic facility needs and repairs that will make Victor Valley College a contributing partner for learning and community economic growth, are addressed. The Board conducted comprehensive evaluations and considered the public's perspective in developing the scope of college facility projects to be funded as reflected in its Educational Master Plan 2007 and its Five-Year Facilities Plan, approved by the Board of Trustees on June 10, 2008, each of which Plans are incorporated herein. The Board concluded that if these needs were not addressed now, Victor Valley College will be unable to remain competitive in preparing adult learners for current and emerging High Desert workforce needs, and university transfer. preparing this Bond Project List, the Board of Trustees determines that Victor Valley College must:

- Expand the number of classrooms and labs that will provide affordable, excellent immediate job training for critical professions with a shortage of workers, such as nurses, emergency medical assistants, as well as other health training programs and public safety programs, such as firefighting and police training.
- Establish a Public Services (Safety) Academy in partnership with the Apple Valley Fire Protection District to establish programs in Fire Technology, Emergency Medical Services, Police/Criminal Justice, and other law enforcement programs.
- Renovate and expand aging, outdated science classrooms and vocational training facilities to insure that they are safe, energy efficient and provide access to up-to-date

computers and the instructional technology that is necessary to prepare students to be competitive in the job market.

- Establish a Workforce Development Center to expand programs in nursing, healthcare, business, real estate, hospitality and general education classes.
- Provide safe classroom throughout the High Desert served by Victor Valley College to allow adult learners to receive job training skills, and to enable more local students to transfer to four year universities.
- Insure that Victor Valley College is part of the solution to the economic challenges of the region and provide training for employees of attractive profitable businesses in the High Desert.
- Insure that all bond funds stay in the local community and that such funds are leveraged to qualify for State matching funds, which would otherwise be granted to other districts.

The Bond Projects List, the Educational Master Plan 2007 and the Five-Year Facilities Plan are each on file at the office of the President/Superintendent and include the following types of projects:

Classroom Construction and Improvements to Enhance Job Training Projects

<u>Goal and Purpose</u>: To respond to the critical shortage of healthcare workers and to increase opportunities for career training in nursing and healthcare as well as technical and work force job training and to provide more classrooms for classes necessary to transfer to a 4-year university, to be housed within a Workforce Development Center:

- Construct and equip a new Workforce Development Center to provide:
 - Health Services Academy for training/classroom facilities to:
 - train registered nurses
 - train respiratory therapists
 - train certified nursing assistants
 - train medical assistants
 - train certified lab technicians, in pharmacy, medical transcription, medical records, radiology and psychiatry.
 - <u>Business Administration Academy</u> for training/classroom facilities and equipment for jobs in emerging business and industries locating in the High Desert.
 - <u>Hospitality Academy</u> for training/classroom facilities and equipment for job training in the growing food service industries.
 - <u>Logistics Transportation Academy</u> for buildings, programs, and equipment to train students for jobs generated by aviation-related businesses.
 - <u>General Education</u> and basic skills classrooms and equipment for college transfer classes, including math, science, English and technology.

Classroom Construction and Improvements to Enhance Public Safety Job Training Projects

<u>Goal and Purpose</u>: To respond to the shortage of public safety workers, especially firefighters and law enforcement professionals, as well as emergency medical technicians, by expanding those programs at a new Public Services (Safety) Academy, in partnership with local firefighters and the Apple Valley Fire District.

- Construct and equip a Public Services (Safety) Center to provide:
 - <u>Fire Technology Department</u> to expand the training of firefighters and advanced certifications within the fire protection field.
 - <u>Administration of Justice Department</u> to expand the careers in law enforcement, corrections, and security.
 - <u>Paramedic Academy</u> to provide state-of-the-art training in emergency medical services, both as technician and a paramedic.
 - <u>General Education</u> and basic skills classrooms and equipment for college transfer classes, including math, English, science and technology.

Main Campus Renovation and Upgrade Projects

<u>Goal and Purpose</u>: Victor Valley College will benefit from the repair, upgrade and improvement of science buildings, labs, classrooms, and computer learning labs, allowing all students to have the resources they need to learn and compete for jobs in today's competitive and global workforce:

- Expand and equip science buildings to include additional science class laboratories, improved science technology apparatus to provide modern, up-to-date instruction.
- Upgrade science building infrastructure to expand electrical service capacity to relieve aging
 or overloaded electrical systems, replace existing water, sewer and plumbing systems to meet
 current codes, eliminate lead-containing fixtures, upgrade aging and deteriorating bathrooms
 and replace older heating, ventilation, air conditioning and lighting systems with building
 code compliant, energy efficient systems.
- Retire past funding utilized for campus improvements, making more funding available for instruction and other academic programs.

Listed building, construction, repair and rehabilitation projects and upgrades will be completed as needed. Each project is assumed to include its share of furniture, equipment, architectural, engineering, and similar planning costs, program management, staff training expenses and a customary contingency for unforeseen design and construction costs. In addition to the listed repair and construction projects stated above, the Bond Projects List also includes the acquisition of a variety of instructional, maintenance and operational equipment, the construction of new buildings, if necessary to serve students, the acquisition of land, the payment of the costs of preparation of all facility planning, facility assessment reviews, environmental studies and construction documentation, the acquisition of outstanding ground leases, temporary housing of dislocated District activities caused by bond projects and the leasing or acquisition of a transportation lot for school buses. The

allocation of bond proceeds will be affected by the District's receipt of State matching funds and the final costs of each project. In the absence of State matching funds, which the District will aggressively pursue to reduce the District's share of the costs of the projects, the District will not be able to complete some of the projects listed above. Certain projects may be undertaken as joint use projects in cooperation with other local public agencies. The budget for each project is an estimate and may be affected by factors beyond the District's control. The final cost of each project will be determined as plans are finalized, construction bids are awarded and projects are completed. Based on the final costs of each project, certain of the projects described above may be delayed or may not be completed. Demolition of existing facilities and reconstruction of facilities scheduled for repair and upgrade may occur, if the Board determines that such an approach would be more cost-effective in creating more enhanced and operationally efficient campuses. Necessary preparation/restoration may occur in connection with new construction, renovation or remodeling, or installation or removal of relocatable classrooms, including ingress and egress, removing, replacing, or installing irrigation, utility lines, trees and landscaping, relocating fire access roads, and acquiring any necessary easements, licenses, or rights of way to the property. Proceeds of the bonds may be used to pay or reimburse the District for the cost of District staff when performing work on or necessary and incidental to bond projects. Bond proceeds shall only be expended for the specific purposes identified herein. The District shall create an account into which proceeds of the bonds shall be deposited and comply with the reporting requirements of Government Code § 53410.

PROJECT CONSTRUCTION ACCOUNTABILITY AND SAFEGUARDS. EACH PROJECT PAID FOR WITH BOND MONEY WILL BE SUBJECT TO OVERSIGHT OF A PROFESSIONAL CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT FIRM WITH A PROVEN TRACK RECORD OF DELIVERING COLLEGE CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS ON-TIME AND ON-BUDGET TO SAVE TAXPAYER DOLLARS.

NO ADMINISTRATOR SALARIES. PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF THE BONDS AUTHORIZED BY THIS PROPOSITION SHALL BE USED ONLY FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, RECONSTRUCTION, REHABILITATION, OR REPLACEMENT OF SCHOOL FACILITIES, INCLUDING THE FURNISHING AND EQUIPPING OF SCHOOL FACILITIES, AND NOT FOR ANY OTHER PURPOSE, INCLUDING TEACHER AND SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR SALARIES AND OTHER OPERATING EXPENSES.

ABSTRACT

Victor Valley College is a two-year community college located in the High Desert region of San Bernardino County, 90 miles east of Los Angeles. It serves an area of 2,200 square miles and a population of over 300,000. Designated as a "financially distressed area" by the California Community College Chancellor's Office, the GEAR UP Partnership program will serve as the catalyst and facilitator for all activities, strategies, and events that are designed to achieve improvement in the academic performance of students from the target GEAR UP schools. Only 10% of parents whose children attend the target schools have obtained a college degree, compared to 28% in the state. Dropout rates from high schools are far above the national level, exceeding 18% across the District and well above 20% in some locales. Working collaboratively with the High Desert Cal-PASS (Partnership for Achieving Student Success) GEAR UP will assist in effectively increasing early college awareness and readiness, by providing consistent and timely academic advising, tutoring, mentoring, and a host of other comprehensive services. Serving 1475 students beginning in the seventh grades at five eligible middle schools, the Project will provide critically needed educational and support services to eligible low-income middle school students. The overall goal of the Project is to enable students to stay in school, become academically successful, and take appropriate courses to attend college. Schools will promote rigorous coursework, and students' progress will be monitored to ensure that they will be academically prepared for college.
